"Who told you that you were naked?" asked God. "Did you eat from the tree that I told you not to eat from?"



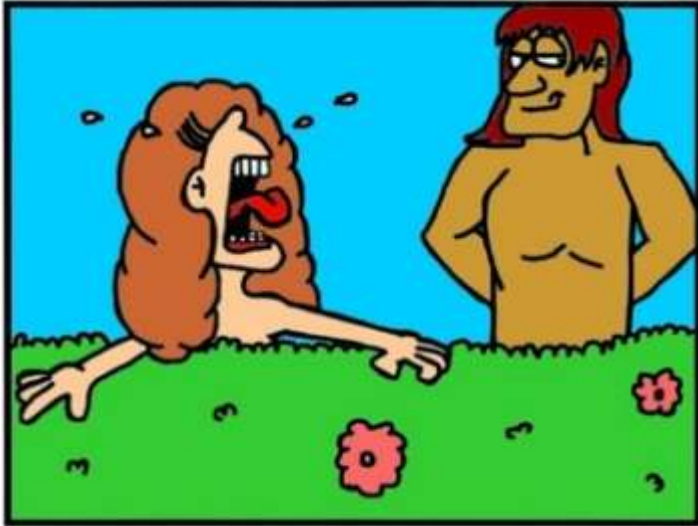
"The woman you gave, to be with me, she gave me the fruit and I ate it," answered Adam.
