"We're going with you," said Ruth and Orpah, the girls who were married to Naomi's sons.



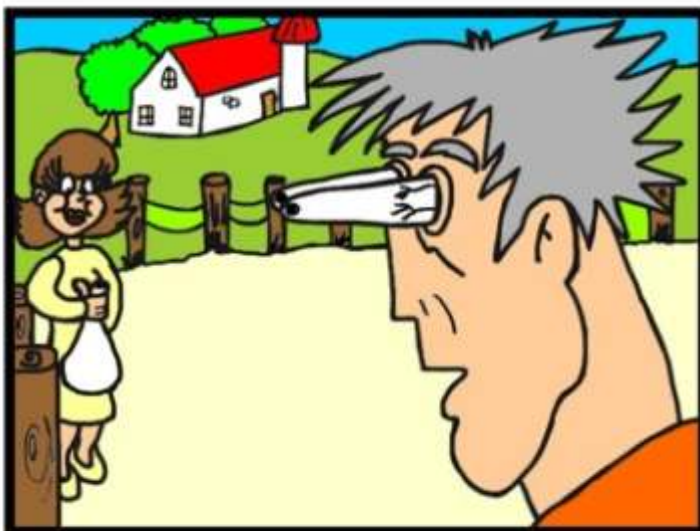


"I have nothing to offer you. Go home to your parents. Get married again," sobbed old Naomi.

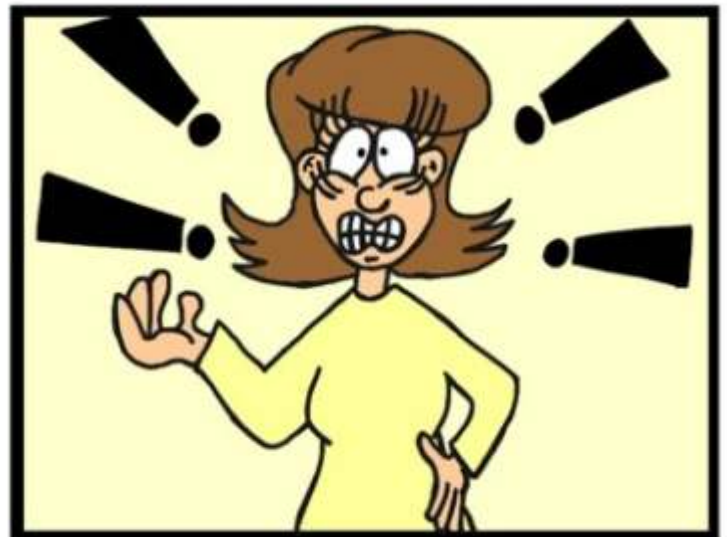
