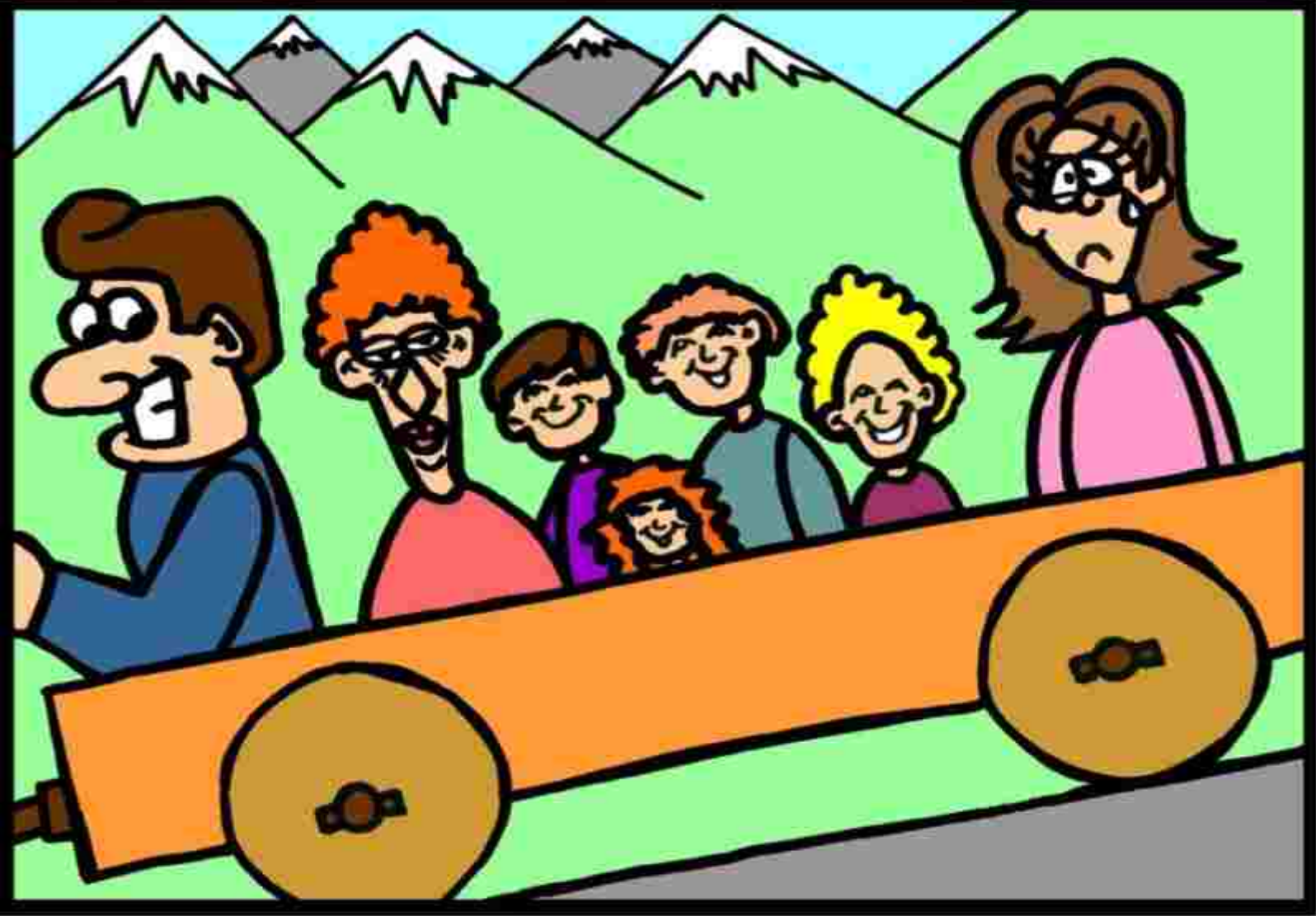


Birth of Samuel

1 Samuel 3 & 7)*

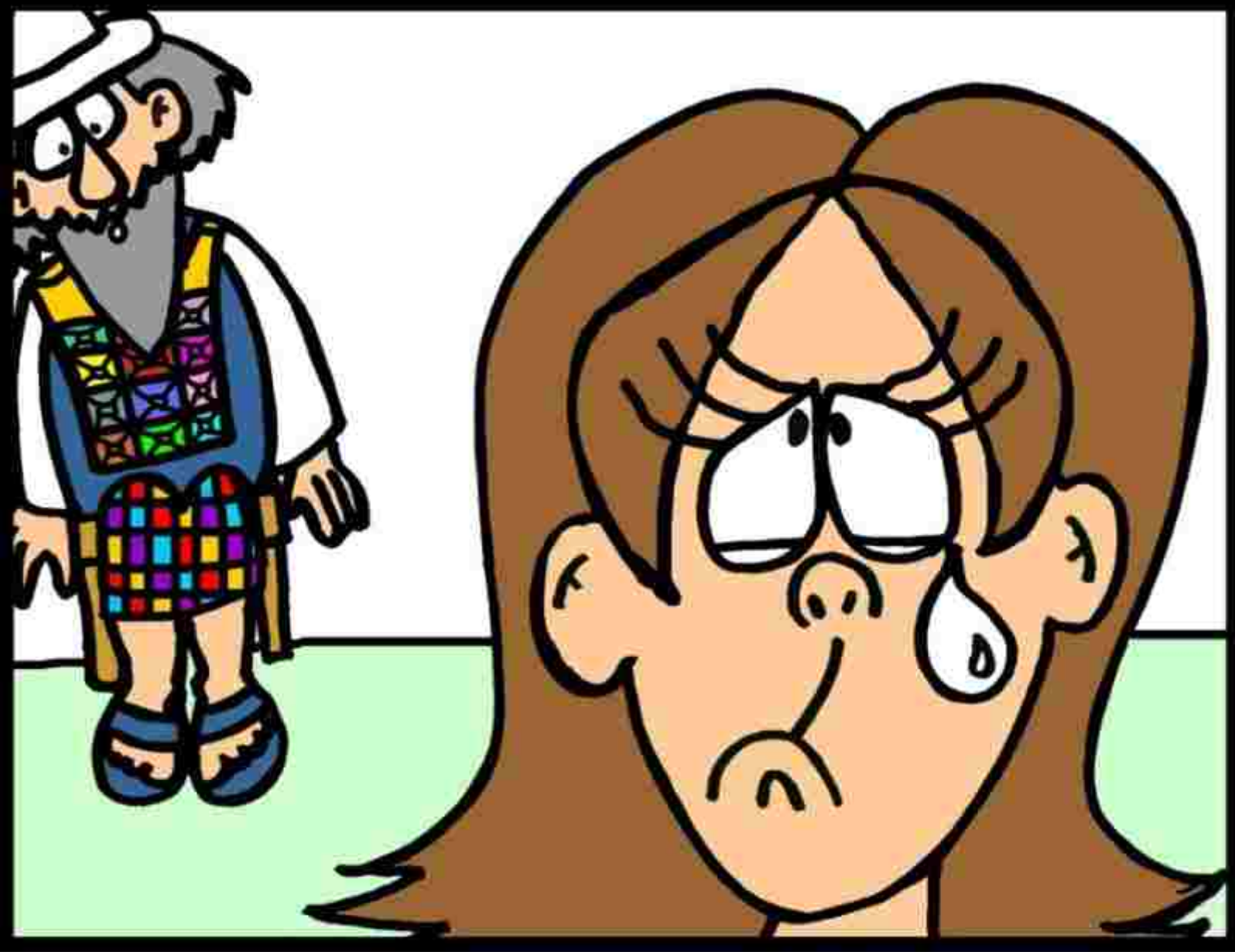

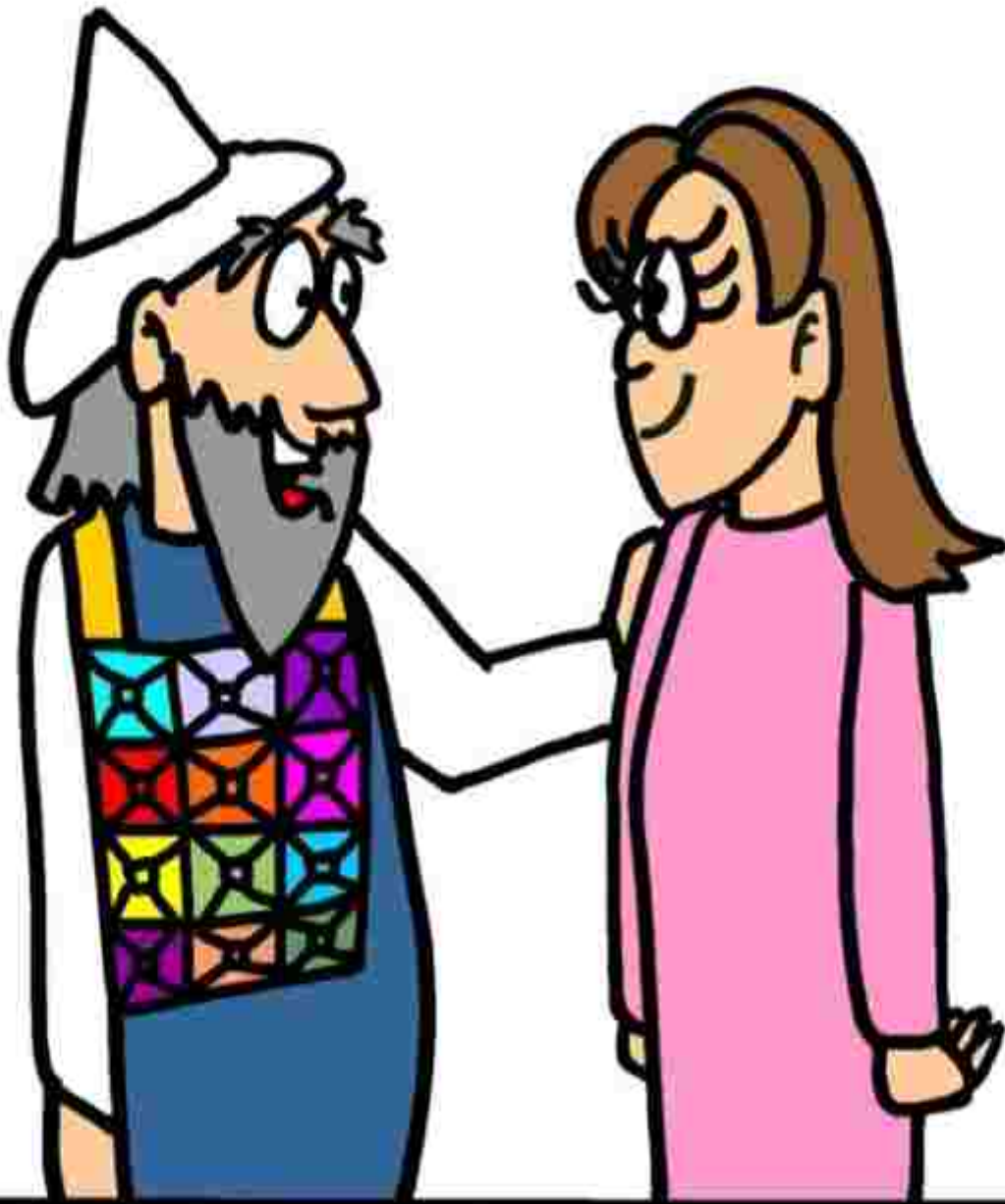
Peninnah made fun of Hannah because she couldn't have any babies. This would make Hannah weep. She was so sad she did not even want to eat.



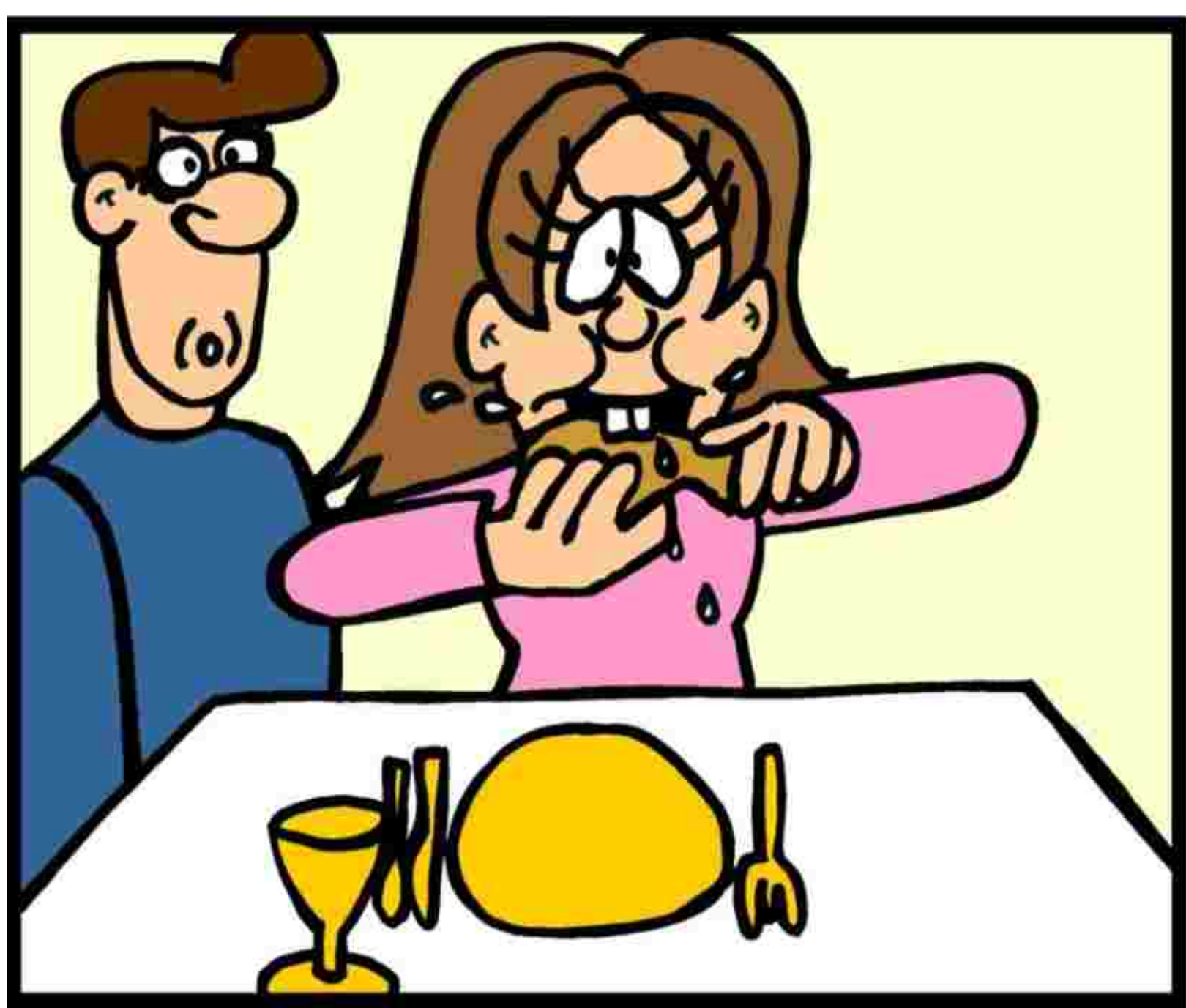

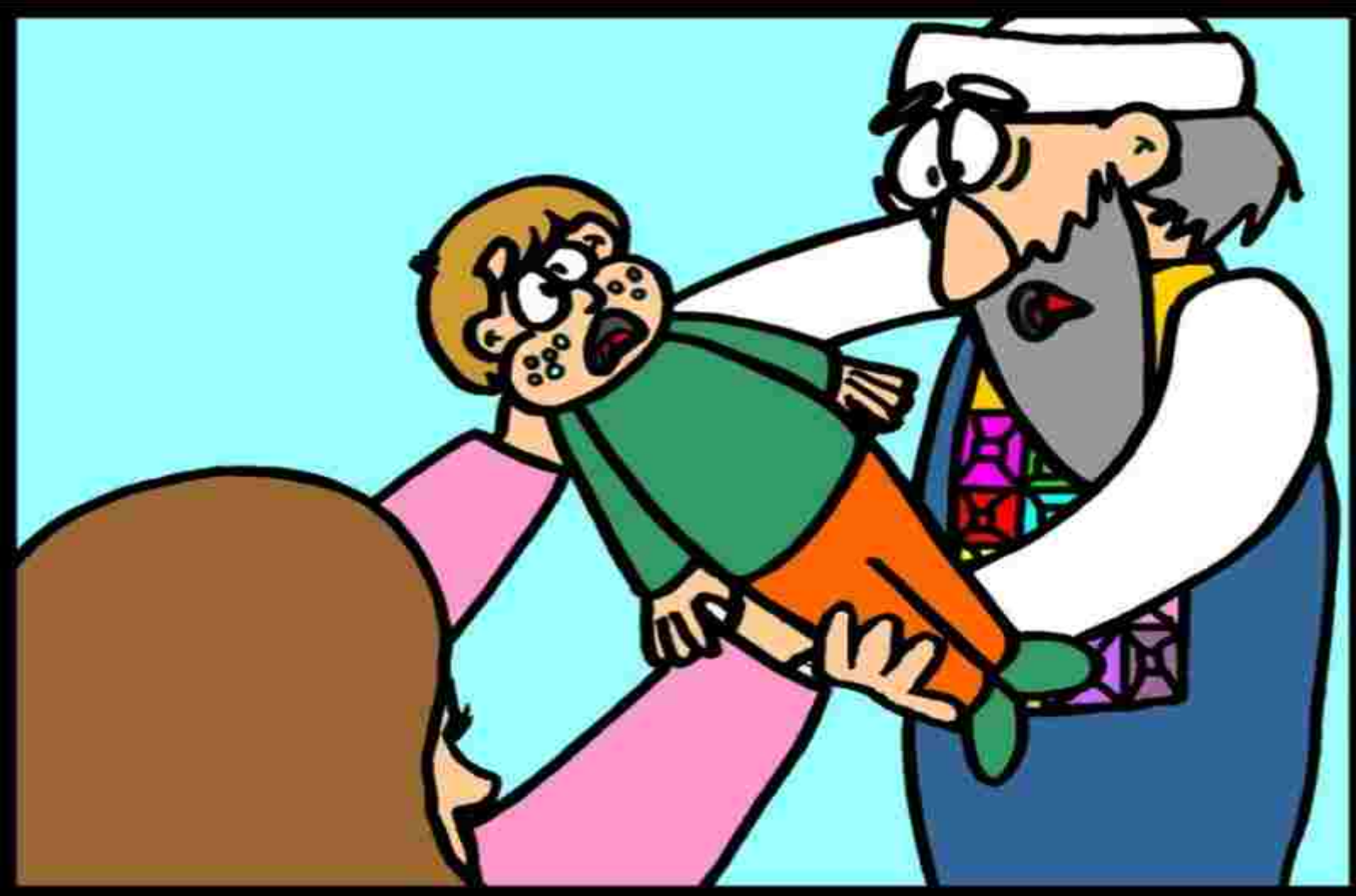

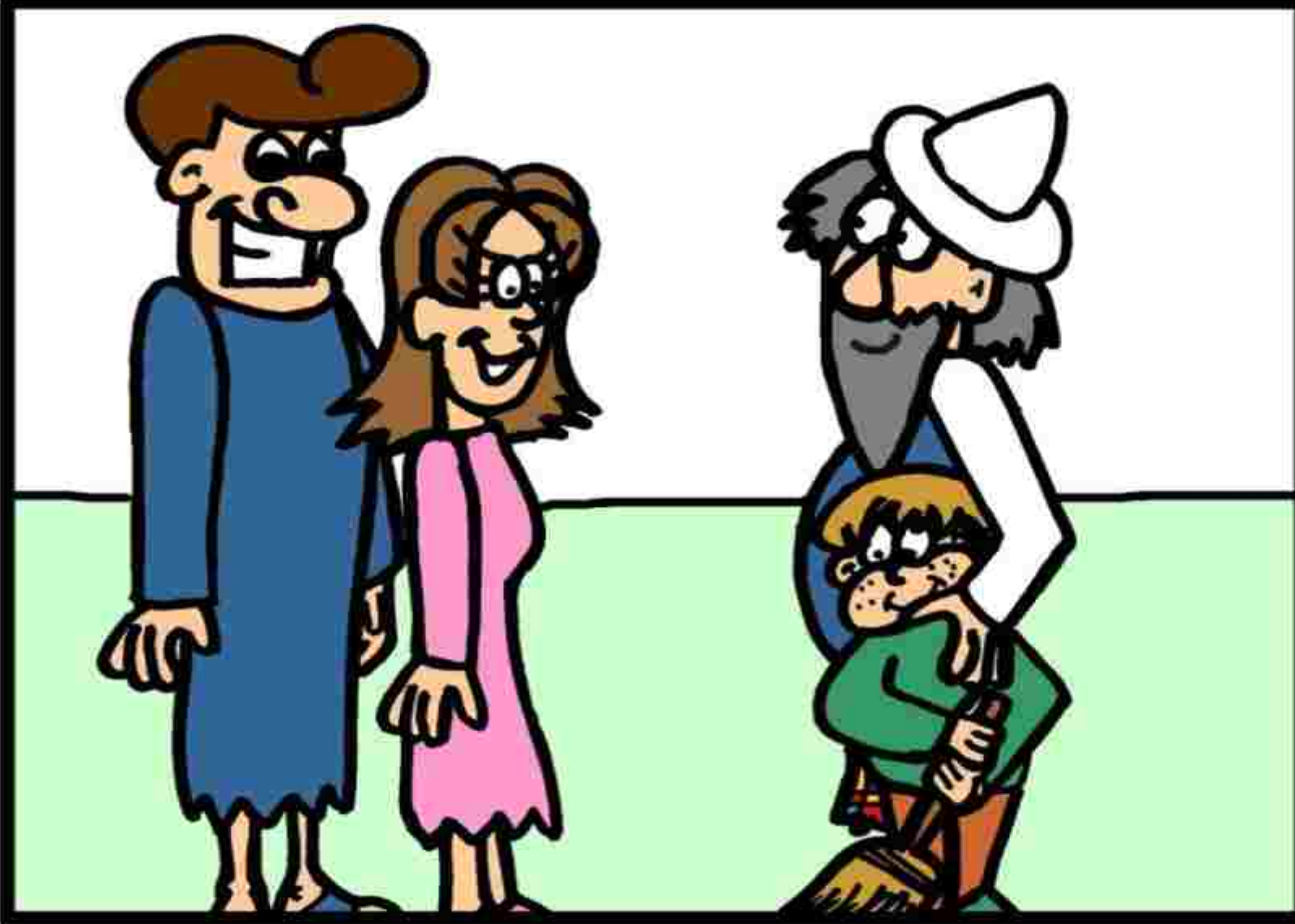
Priest Eli tenderly said to her, "Go in peace and the God of Israel give to you what you have asked of him."
