
## David & Goliath

(Based on 1 Samuel 17)





"Did you hear?" they spoke to each other. "Whoever kills that giant, King Saul will make him rich, give his daughter to marry and his family won't pay any more taxes!"




David said, "Tell me again. What will happen for the person who kills this giant? Who does that Philistine think he is anyway that he should mouth off to the army of the Living God?!!!"






"What did I say wrong? Isn't it true what I said?" answered David. Then David turned to the men again and asked for a third time to hear about the rewards for killing the giant.




King Saul put all his armour on David, but David was not comfortable wearing it since he had never tried it out before. Instead he chose five smooth stones from the river and took his slingshot.
