
Jesus Walks on the Water

(Based on Matthew 14:22-33, Mark 6:45-51)



One day after healing sick people all day, Jesus made his disciples get into a boat. "You guys cross over the sea ahead of me and I'll join you later," said Jesus.




While they traveled in the boat, Jesus sent all the crowds away.




Then he climbed up on a mountain, by himself and he prayed.
