
## Shimei Curses David


Now when King David had to leave Jerusalem because of Absalom's rebellion, a man named Shimei walked along the hillside and threw stones at King David.




Then he started yelling rude words to David. "Get out! Get out you bloody man, you man from the devil!" David's men wanted to kill Shimei, but David would not let them.




David knew the man. He was a relative of dead King Saul. He was angry because his family was not the royal family any more.

Shimei was one of the people who came to meet him. "Oh King David, please forgive me for all those bad things I said. I sinned really badly that day." He knew he was in trouble.




David's men wanted to kill him. "I know I'm the king and you know I'm the king. I promise I won't have you killed," said David to Shimei.
